# 2024 Year in Review



FOR 60 YEARS, the Dermatology Foundation has invested in the future of our field thanks to the support of our many donors, partners, and volunteers. As we begin our 61st year, we recognize our shared mission has never been more important. Changes in the political landscape and research funding promise to create more challenges for those working to establish an investigative career and bring new discoveries to the specialty.

The DF remains second only to the National Institutes of Health in supporting dermatological research and remains the only private source of funding devoted to advancing the entire specialty. We invest in the most promising investigators early in their careers so they can generate the data needed to secure major research funding. These early investments are critical to building a research workforce capable of driving scientific discovery and advancing patient care.

#### **Fueling Discovery**

This year we were proud to award \$3.3 million to 54 early career investigators pursuing unique ideas in 38 research areas. This funding level increased by 11% over last year and includes a much-needed increase in the value of every early career award the DF offers. We are sincerely grateful to our many member physicians who donated \$1.3 million and to our industry and society partners who contributed \$2 million.

Education is the bridge between discovery and practice, and the annual DF Clinical Symposium in Naples, Florida, once again brought practitioners cutting-edge information from leaders in the field. Attendees often call the symposium the best conference they attend all year because of the quality of topics and speakers. We are pleased that more than half of the experts presenting in 2025 were recipients of DF research awards early in their careers.

#### Shaping the Future Together

In 2024, the DF was proud to collaborate with two prominent organizations to further our specialty. In partnership with the Skin of Color Society, we instituted the DF SOCS Collaborative Mid-career Research Award, sponsored by Sanofi-Regeneron, which funds exemplary research on skin disorders that disproportionately affect underserved or underrepresented groups. We were also pleased to work with the Hidradenitis Suppurativa Foundation, a generous supporter of the DF, to offer and support a career development award focused on expanding our understanding of HS.



# Research Award Program

The Dermatology Foundation invests in early and mid-career researchers with novel ideas and the strong potential to achieve scientific discoveries that lead to new treatments and improved patient care. Identifying those promising researchers and their meritorious projects is the role of the DF's Medical and Scientific Committee and the Clinical, Medical, Surgical, Dermatopathology Panel, made up of 19 specialty leaders whose expertise spans the field. The committee and panel members review proposals following a rigorous process based on the National Institutes of Health study section.

# **Bristol Myers Squibb Psoriasis Research Award**

The Bristol Myers Squibb Psoriasis Research Award supports the research of an outstanding mid-career investigator with an established trajectory of excellence in basic, clinical, or translational science. Funded research is centered on advancing the understanding or treatment of psoriasis. This award provides \$100,000 in research dollars per year for up to three years.




